Teaser	Would you like to work as a geriatric nurse in Germany? Then you need a state permit. To do so, you must submit an application and have your foreign professional qualification recognized.
Volltext	The profession of geriatric nurse is regulated in Germany. This means that in order to work as a geriatric nurse in Germany, you need a state permit.





Sachverhalt

With this permit, you can use the professional title "geriatric nurse" and work in the profession. You can also apply to use the professional title "geriatric nurse".

If you have a professional qualification from the European Union (EU), the European Economic Area (EEA) or Switzerland, you can also obtain a state permit from the competent authority in Germany. In order to obtain the permit, you must have your foreign professional qualification recognized.

On January 1, 2020, nursing training in Germany was reformed and the new Nursing Professions Act came into force. There is a transitional period for the recognition of foreign professional qualifications on the basis of the Geriatric Nursing Act. Your foreign professional qualification may still be recognized under the old Geriatric Nursing Act on a transitional basis until 31 December 2024. The responsible office will advise you.

In the recognition procedure, the competent body will compare your professional qualification from abroad with the German professional qualification and check its equivalence. The equivalence of the professional qualification is an important prerequisite for the granting of a state license.

In addition to the equivalence of the professional qualification, you must also meet other requirements for the permit to be issued. Further requirements include, for example, sufficient German language skills and health suitability.

If your professional qualification does not originate from the EU, the EEA or Switzerland, other regulations apply.

You can also apply for the procedure from abroad.

Erforderliche Unterlagen

The responsible office will tell you which documents you need to submit. Important documents are generally

Proof of identity (identity card or passport)

- Marriage certificate (if your name has changed due to marriage)
 - Curriculum vitae
- Proof of your professional qualifications (e.g. certificates, professional certificate)
- Proof of training
- Proof of your relevant professional experience in a profession comparable to geriatric care
- Proof of other relevant knowledge for working as a geriatric nurse
- Information about an application for recognition that has already been submitted. Then state the body to which you have submitted the application.
- Proof that you wish to work in the profession in Germany
- Do you still live or work in a third country, i.e. not in the EU, the EEA or Switzerland? Then you may have to prove that you have received a commitment from a health and care institution to work as a nurse in Germany.

You usually submit these documents later. The responsible office will inform you when you should submit the documents:

- Proof of your personal suitability: criminal record extract or certificate of good conduct from your country of origin. The certificate must not be older than 3 months at the time of application.
- Proof of your health suitability: Medical certificate. The certificate must not be older than 3 months at the time of application.
- Proof of your German language skills: Language certificate

The responsible office will let you know which documents you need to submit as a simple copy, a certified copy or the original.

Voraussetzungen

- You have a comparable professional qualification as a geriatric nurse from the EU, the EEA or Switzerland.
 - You want to work as a geriatric nurse in Germany.
- Personal suitability: You are reliable to work as a geriatric nurse and have no criminal record.
- Health suitability: You are mentally and physically fit to work as a geriatric nurse.
- You have German language skills at the required level. This is normally language level B2 according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR).

Kosten

The costs generally depend on the time and effort required for processing.

Additional costs may also be incurred (e.g. for translations, certifications or compensatory measures such as an adaptation period or an aptitude test). These costs vary from person to person.

Verfahrensablauf

Application

You apply to the competent authority for permission to use the professional title "geriatric nurse". Or you can apply to use the professional title "geriatric nurse". You can submit the application with the documents to the relevant office, send it by post or upload it electronically. Do not send any originals.

Examination of equivalence

The competent body will then check whether you meet all the requirements. An important requirement is the equivalence of your professional qualification. The competent authority will compare your professional qualification from abroad with the German professional qualification as a geriatric nurse in accordance with the Nursing Professions Act or the Geriatric Care Act. The professional qualification is equivalent if there are no significant differences between your professional qualification and the German professional qualification.

Possible results of the equivalence test

If your professional qualification is equivalent, your foreign professional qualification will be recognized. The competent authority can confirm the result to you in writing. You must still meet the other requirements. You will then receive permission to use the professional title "geriatric nurse".

Are there any significant differences between your professional qualification and the German professional qualification? You may be able to compensate for the differences through your professional experience, other knowledge, skills or competencies (lifelong learning). Knowledge, skills and competences must be certified by an authority in the country in which you acquired the knowledge, skills or competences.

However, it may be that the significant differences cannot be compensated for by your professional experience, knowledge, skills or competences. In this case, the competent authority will inform you of the significant differences between your professional qualification and the German professional qualification and why you cannot compensate for these significant differences.

The competent authority will also inform you of compensatory measures that you can take to offset the significant differences. If you decide not to take compensatory measures, your professional qualification will not be recognized. You will then not be allowed to work as a geriatric nurse in Germany.

Compensatory measures

There are various compensation measures:

- Adaptation course: The adaptation course lasts a maximum of 3 years.
- Aptitude test: In the aptitude test, only those areas in which significant differences have been identified are tested. The aptitude test consists of a practical examination combined with an interview.

	As a rule, you can choose between an adaptation period or an aptitude test.
	If you successfully complete the compensation measure and meet all other requirements, you will receive permission to use the professional title of "geriatric nurse".
Bearbeitungsdauer	3 Monat(e) The responsible office will inform you if any documents are missing. If the documents are complete, the procedure will take a maximum of 3 months.
Frist	There is no deadline. Sometimes documents are still missing from the procedure. The responsible office will then inform you by when you must submit the documents.

Hinweise	**Partial access to the profession for professional qualifications from the EU, the EEA or Switzerland** Your professional qualification is not equivalent and
	the differences are too great? Then you may be able to work in the profession with partial access to the profession. With partial access to the profession, you can also work in the profession without recognition. There are certain requirements for this. Your professional qualification must include at least one so-called **reserved** activity of the German professional qualification. Reserved activities may only be carried out by specially trained persons. You must also provide proof: You are personally suitable, in good health and have the required knowledge of German.
	With partial access to the profession, you may only

carry out certain tasks as a geriatric nurse. You apply for partial access to the profession from the competent authority.

Freedom to provide services

Do you only want to offer services in Germany occasionally and for a short period of time? Then you do not usually need a state permit. You must fulfill these requirements:

- You must be established in another EU or EEA member state or in Switzerland.
- You must provide proof of your professional qualification.
- You must provide proof of German language skills at the required level.
 - You must prove your personal suitability.
- You must notify the competent authority of your activity in writing.

The competent authority will inform you whether you are permitted to provide services or whether you need to take an aptitude test.

Notification of equivalence

The equivalence assessment (recognition procedure) also takes place during the authorization procedure. You can apply for a separate decision on the result of the examination.

Procedure for ethnic German repatriates

As a late repatriate, you can go through the recognition procedure either in accordance with the laws mentioned here or in accordance with the Federal Expellees Act. You can decide for yourself. The responsible office will advise you which procedure is right for you.

Kurztext	 Applying for recognition as a geriatric nurse with a professional qualification from the EU/EEA/Switzerland To work as a geriatric nurse in Germany, you need a state permit. With this permit, you can officially call yourself a "geriatric nurse" and work in the profession. You can also apply to use the professional title "geriatric nurse". Professional qualifications from the European Union (EU), the European Economic Area (EEA) or Switzerland can also be used to obtain a state license in Germany. Nursing training in Germany was reformed on January 1, 2020 and the new Nursing Professions Act applies. There is a transitional period for the recognition of foreign professional qualifications on the basis of the Geriatric Nursing Act. Until 31.12.2024, foreign professional qualifications may still be recognized under the old Geriatric Nursing Act on a transitional basis.
