Teaser	All dogs in Thuringia must be identified with a microchip. This is injected by a veterinarian and contains a transponder number, which ensures an exact assignment of the dog. As proof, every dog owner receives a certificate from the veterinarian.
Volltext	According to § 2 paragraph 4 Thuringian Law for the Protection of the Population against Animal Dangers (ThürTierGefG) every owner of a dog is obliged to mark his dog with a microchip. The veterinarian must issue proof of this identification; compare § 2 paragraph 1 Thüringer Chippflichtverordnung (ThürChipVO). A standardized state form has been created for veterinarians. This proof is to be handed over to the responsible regulatory authority, compare § 3 paragraph 2 ThürChipVO.

Voraussetzungen	The identification must be carried out by all dog owners within three months of acquiring the dog, unless the dog is only staying in Thuringia temporarily (e.g. as part of a vacation) (for a maximum of two months).

Verfahrensablauf	With the acquisition of a dog, the identification of the dog with a chip must take place within three months. This identification obligation begins when the dog is three months old.
Bearbeitungsdauer	
Frist	Within three months from the beginning of keeping the dog, the identification must be made.

Kurztext	• Implantation of identification chips in dogs • All dogs in Thuringia must be identified with a microchip. This is injected by a veterinarian and contains a transponder number, which ensures an exact allocation of the dog. • As proof, every dog owner receives a certificate from the veterinarian. • With the acquisition of a dog, the identification of the dog with a chip must take place within three months. • This identification obligation begins when the dog is three months old. • Responsible: Any established veterinarian can carry out the identification.
